

ARMENIAN KHACHKARS SESSION PLAN

Duration: 60 minutes (or as appropriate for your curriculum)

Description:

This project-based session is designed for children ages 8-14 during which they will be taken on a khachkar-making journey while exploring some fun facts about khachkars, including the symbolism of its four sides, Armenian blooming cross, eternity sign, some motives and much more.

In the culture of any nation, there are special symbols that cannot be met anywhere else. For Armenians, such symbols are khachkars, which are unique cross-stone monuments that reflect the Armenian culture and identity. Connecting both the past and the present, the Armenian khachkars continue to watch over the world's oldest Christian nation, making this unique art form a true Armenian cornerstone.

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SESSION PLAN

ARMENIAN KHACHKARS

AGE

8-12

LANGUAGE

DURATION 60 minutes

PRE-SESSION ACTIVITY: 10 MINUTES

Prepare homemade play-dough prior to the session, following the steps mentioned in Appendix 1.

You can skip this activity if you decide to use play dough or modeling air dry clay you have on hand. They will need three 3ounce cans, preferably in light brown, yellow or orange.

MATERIALS

See **Appendix 1**

water, flour, salt, lemon salt, cream of tartar, vegetable oil, liquid food coloring, vanilla, cup, measuring spoon, saucepan, flour sifter, wooden

WARMUP ACTIVITY: 2 MINUTES

Ask a few warm up questions about khachkars:

Do you know what khachkar is? How is it translated into English? Have you seen a khachkar? Where have you seen one?

MATERIALS/TECHNOLOGY

ACTIVITY THREE: 15 MINUTES

Screen the Armenian Khachkar PowerPoint presentation (refer to Appendix 2) to explore the history, design, uses, purposes and symbolism of Armenian Khachkars.

You can skip the PPT and share some important and interesting facts about Armenian Khachkars (refer to Appendix 3).

ACTIVITY FOUR: 15 MINUTES

Now you're ready to create your own Armenian khachkar.

MATERIALS/TECHNOLOGY

Let's Start Making a Khachkar

Appendix 2

Homemade dough or air dry clay, plastic tablecloth or cutting board, plastic spoon, fork, and knife, chopstick or toothpick, plastic bottle cap and ruler



DO IT YOURSELF



Ingredients

- 1 cup of water
- 1 cup of flour
- 1/2 cup of salt
- 1 teaspoon of lemon salt **OR** 2 tablespoons of cream of tartar
- 1 tablespoon of vegetable oil
- ½ teaspoon of liquid food coloring -light brown or copper or ivory (optional)
- ½ teaspoon of vanilla (optional)

Some Tools You'll Need To Make the Play-Dough

Measuring cups, measuring spears, saucepan, flour sifter, and wooden spoon.

Step by Step Instructions


- Mix sifted flour, salt and lemon salt (or cream of tartar) together in a saucepan.
- Add grew drops of food color to water, then stir into the flour mixture.
- Add vegetable oil and stip.
- Heat your burner to medium/low and cook stirring until your play-dough starts to solidify. Don't worry about the lumps. You can work them out later.
- Once the dough starts gathering together around the spoon you know it's done.
 This may be 20-30 seconds (on a gas stove) or 2-3 minutes (on an electric stove).
- Remove the play-dough from the saucepan and put it on a plate to cool
- Once it is cooled, knead the play-dough for a minute or two to get out any lumps.
- Put the dough in a ziploc bag and have it ready for the meetup session.



FUN FACTS ABOUT ARMENIAN KHACHKARS

ITS MEANING

Khachkar consists of two words **khach and kar**.

In Armenian «khach» means a cross, and «kar» means a stone.

ITS HISTORY

The history of the origin of khachkars goes back to many years ago and is connected with the adoption of Christianity in **301 AD**.



DID YOU KNOW?

There are khachkars in almost every corner of the world .



Khachkars are **only** carved by Armenian cartsmen or sculptors in Armenia and communities in the



The upper part of khachkars is called the crown. The right side is related to the distribution of grace, the left side, to the forgiveness of sins, and the bottom part symbolizes the fall of hell



The sun or the
Armenian eternity
sign is often engraved
at the bottom of the
khachkar.

The cross is usually surrounded by different types of motifs and ornaments like grapes, pomegranate animals, saints, or humanlike images.

Sprouting and blooming motifs of the cross— make the khachkar a version of the Tree of Life—are prominent features.



Amongst so many khachkars in Armenia and all over the world, each has its own pattern, and no two khachkars are the same.

KHACHKARI

The oldest surviving Khachkar was found in Artsakh, Vas huhas village. This Khachkar is actually 1,156 years old and was created in 866 AD.



ONE!

The second oldest surviving khachkar, which was found in Garni village in Armenia, was created in 879 AD.

KHACHKAR VARBEDS

Khachkar carvers are called **varbeds** in Armenian. They choose the style and images of khachkars themselves.



LET'S MAKE AN ARMENIAN KHACHKAR

Materials and Tools Needed:

- some homemade dough or air-dry clay
- a plastic tablecloth or cutting board
- a plastic spoon and knife
- a chopstick or toothpick
- a plastic bottle cap
- a ruler



STEP 1:

Make a round ball.



STEP 2

Cut the ball into 2 pieces using a plastic knife. Make sure that one piece is larger than the other one



STEE

Make two round balls



Meld the large piece into itectangular shape. Don't make it thin. Have the diffat, so that the khachkar



Carve horizontal lines on the top and bottom of the khachka with a ruler. Make the top a little wider and the bottom part



Carve 2 vertical lines on the right and left sides without reaching the edges



Find the center of the khachkar.
Carve the cross using your ruler
and toothpick. Make a circle
between the cross and the
bottom line using the bottle



Carve the 4 sides of the cross
to get triangular shapes – three
small and one large. Now that
you have the cross ready, let's
design it.



STEP 9:

Carve 2 small and short lines to the corners of the cross with the toothpick.



STEP 10:

Carve diagonal lines on both sides of the khachkar using your plastic knife.



STEP 11

Carve two pomegranates on the right and left sides of the cross.



STEP 12

Connect the pomegranates with curved lines to the upper part of the cross.



STEP

From the bottomed the circle carve some wave-shaped inest to represent the plants.



S EP 14A

Carve ? grapes under the



STEP 15:

On the top part of the khachkar, carve diagonal lines and make small halls inside.



STED 16

Carve 6 semi-curved lines inside the circle to complete the Armenian eternity sign



STEP 17:

Get the small piece that you put aside and make a flat rectangular base and attach the khachkar to it.

Your unique Armenian Khachkar is now ready!
